IMPACTS

- Thirteen members competed in District 1 Archery, .22 rifle, Entomology ID, and Public Speaking contests
- More 4H members validated more steers for the first time in over 15 years.
- 50 volunteers prepared and served meals daily to over 1500 tornado first responders and victims for 14 days.

4-H & Youth Development:

- ▶ Two members met three times to prepare and compete in the District 1 Entomology Identification Contest. The team placed 4th.
- ▶ Three Archery project members met 4 times under the leadership of a certified volunteer to prepare for the district archery competition. The placings brought home in the various divisions included one 1st, one 2nd and one 8th.
- ➤ Six .22 Rifle project members met 6 times under the leadership of a certified volunteer to prepare for the district .22 Rifle contest.
- ▶ 1 Public speaking project member competed in the District Senior Public Speaking Contest and placed 6th.
- ▶ Seven 4H members validated 11 steers for 2024 major shows. This is the highest number of members and steers in over 15 years.



Emergency Management:

On June 15, 2023 a tornado rated at EF3 struck Perryton and destroyed over 230 homes, 93 business, plus killing three people and injuring over 200. Texas A&M AgriLife Extension in Ochiltree County responded in the following manner.

- Coordinated with the County Emergency Management Coordinator, Ochiltree County Commissioners Court, Perryton City Manager and Perryton Fire Department, and District 1 County agents to set up a relief and supply point for victims and first responders at the Ochiltree County Expo Center. Emergency supplies were distributed to over 700 victims.
- Provided leadership over 50 volunteers to secure fresh food donations to cook and serve over 1500 meals daily for 14 days to first responders and victims.
- Assisted local veterinarian Dr. Randy Skaggs and the County EMC to secure the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Strike team to care for injured and displaced pets.
